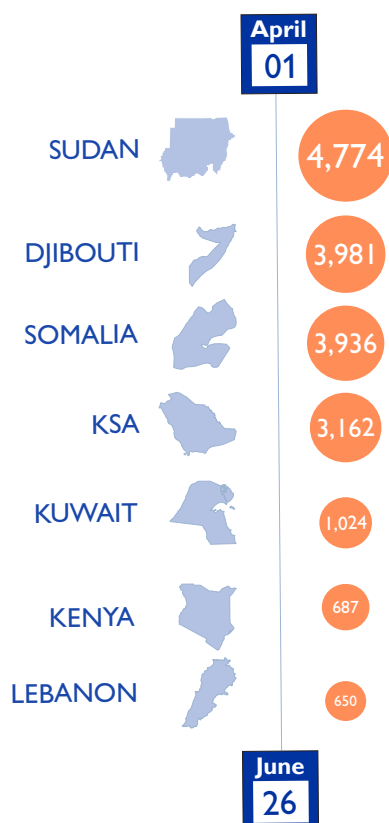

1 Partnerships and Coordination

- As the designated lead agency for supporting the Government of Ethiopia (GoE) in the management of migrant returnees, IOM continued to support GoE in coordinating support for quarantine facilities in Addis Ababa and the regions (54 in total).

Returnee migrants by country



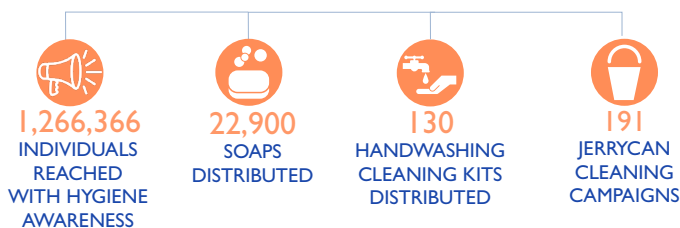
2 Disease Surveillance

- Between 1 April and 26 June, Ethiopia received over 18,650 returnees: 4,774 from Sudan, 3,981 from Djibouti, 3,936 from Somalia, 3,162 from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA), 1024 from Kuwait, 650 from Lebanon and 687 from Kenya.
- Completed construction of 2 screening points at the entry and exit of Bule Hora town: temperature and symptoms screening.
- Five IOM health staff trained for COVID-19 sample collection at Ethiopia Public Health Institute (EPHI).
- Registered 1,348 new returnees (291 Female / 1,057 Male).
- Continued to provide direct assistance to migrant returnees in quarantine facilities, including food and water assistance to migrants in Jijiga, onward transportation assistance to 54 returnees from Dollo Ado and Moyale, and family tracing and reunification for 5 female Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC) who arrived from Lebanon in Addis Ababa.
- Continued to distribute PPE (177 packs surgical masks, gloves and 380 packs of face shields and 8 thermometers) to quarantine facilities in Addis Ababa. Distributed NFIs, including 2,134 mosquito nets, 717 laundry soaps and 750 jerrycans in Metema quarantine facility.

3 ■ Protection

- Newly recruited mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) frontline workers to be deployed to different regions of Ethiopia trained on the medical aspects of COVID-19.

5 ■ Point of Entry

- Following the assessment of temporary shelter needs at Dewele PoE, where returnees from Djibouti remain stranded, IOM is constructing partitions in Dewele PoE for returnees awaiting transportation to quarantine facilities in Dire Dawa.

6 ■ Camp Coordination and Camp Management

- IOM/Site Management Support (SMS) Working Group continues to coordinate between Shelter, WASH, Health Clusters and Government agencies on the mitigation of COVID-19 in IDP sites identified as most at-risk.
- So far 78% of Priority 1 sites for Shelter Decongestion and 74% of Priority 1 sites for Water supply increase are not yet covered by either funding and/or Partner capacity, while 96% of Priority IDP sites have no SMS partner present.
- IOM/SMS Working Group has updated its operational guidance on COVID-19 mitigation in IDP sites for site-based actors in Ethiopia. The finalised version is expected to be published next week.

7 ■ National Laboratory Systems

- The COVID-19 testing laboratory set up at Addis Ababa Science and Technology University (AASTU) quarantine facility, with two IOM laboratory assistants to support, is now functional.

8 ■ Displacement Tracking Matrix

- Regular mobility tracking has been updated with COVID-19 related indicators, including looking at impact on IDPs and returnees.
