

### OVERVIEW

Supporting the Government of Ethiopia's efforts to respond to the urgent needs of vulnerable migrants, Migration Response Centres (MRCs) provide life-saving assistance to stranded migrants along the main migratory routes in Ethiopia including in Dire Dawa, Metema, Moyale, Semera, and Tog-wachalle.

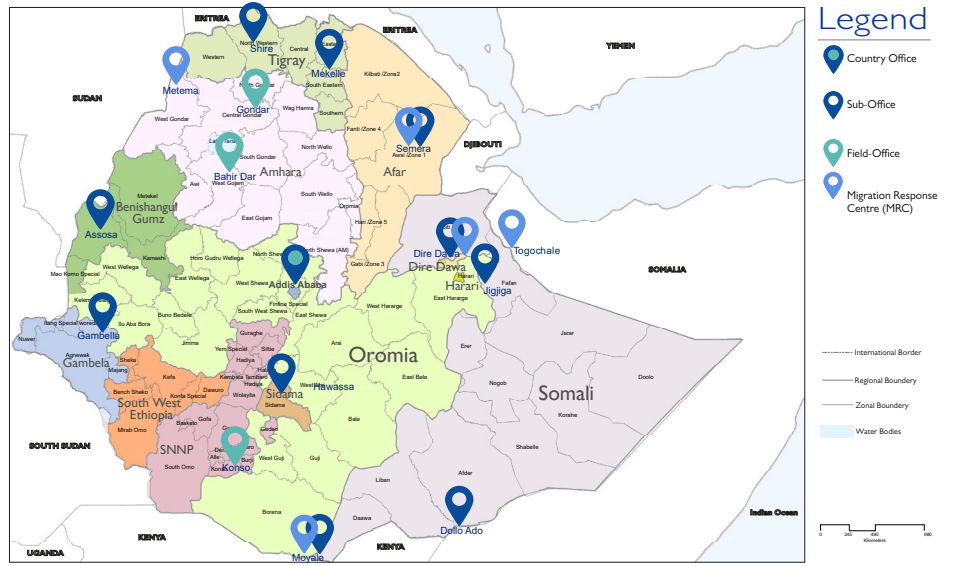
Migrants that are assisted in MRCs are screened for vulnerabilities and receive immediate and long-term support as required.

Each MRC is managed by a Management Committee comprised of government representatives and local key stakeholders. IOM ensures smooth daily operations including delivery of direct assistance and referrals to specialized services.

737 migrants received non-food items (NFIs), temporary accommodation, food, water and awareness raising



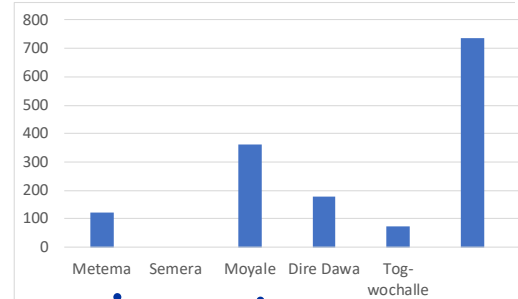
552 migrants received transportation assistance to return to their communities of origin

Since January 2022, IOM assisted 5,268 migrants across five MRCs. A total of 737 migrants received assistance in July.

### VULNERABILITY PROFILE OF MIGRANTS ASSISTED

In July, 166 MRC beneficiaries had heightened vulnerabilities to exploitation and abuse. This included 107 unaccompanied migrant children, 42 accompanied migrant children and 17 migrants with serious medical needs.
