

## IOM ETHIOPIA'S RESPONSE TO THE SUDAN CRISIS

21 June 2023



Armed conflict in Sudan has forced hundreds of thousands of people to flee to neighbouring countries. As of 19 June 2023, 51,000 people have arrived in Ethiopia through multiple border crossing points in Amhara, Benishangul Gumz, and Gambella Regions.
