

The Emergency and Post-Crisis (EPC) unit, which is the humanitarian arm of IOM Ethiopia, effectively addresses the mobility dimensions of a crisis. IOM Ethiopia is headquartered in Addis Ababa, with a strong geographical presence throughout the country with sub-offices in six regions: Benishangul-Gumuz (Assosa), Somali (Jigjiga and Dolo Ado), Gambella (Gambella), Oromia (Moyale, Bule Hora, Nekempt), Afar (Semera), Tigray (Shire), Southern Nations, Nationalities, and Peoples (Dilla), and Dire Dawa City.

The unit's humanitarian response activities in Ethiopia include internal displacement information management

through the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), provision of emergency shelter and non-food items (ES/NFI); transitional shelter (TS); water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services; mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS); site management support (SMS) for displacement communities; transportation and relocation support for refugees; and transition and recovery (TR) programming linking humanitarian assistance to recovery.

IOM is a key agency and standing member of the Ethiopian Humanitarian Country Team (EHCT) and the Government of Ethiopia's (GoE) National Disaster Risk Management Commission (NDRMC) preparedness and response efforts,

such as the annual inter-agency Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP).

As the Shelter/NFI (S/NFI) Cluster lead agency, co-chaired with the GoE/NDRMC, IOM is a member of the Disaster Risk Management Technical Working Group (DRMTWG), the Inter-Cluster Coordination Group (ICCG), and the National Flood Task Force (NFTF). IOM has been a pioneer of durable solutions within the country and is co-chair of the Federal Durable Solutions Working Group (DSWGs) and several Regional DSWGs along with the GoE

SHEDTER AND NON-FOOD ITEMS



Improving the lives of displaced persons in Ethiopia through provision of basic emergency shelter, shelter repairs, rehabilitation and providing essential lifesaving support as the ESNFI Kit.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE



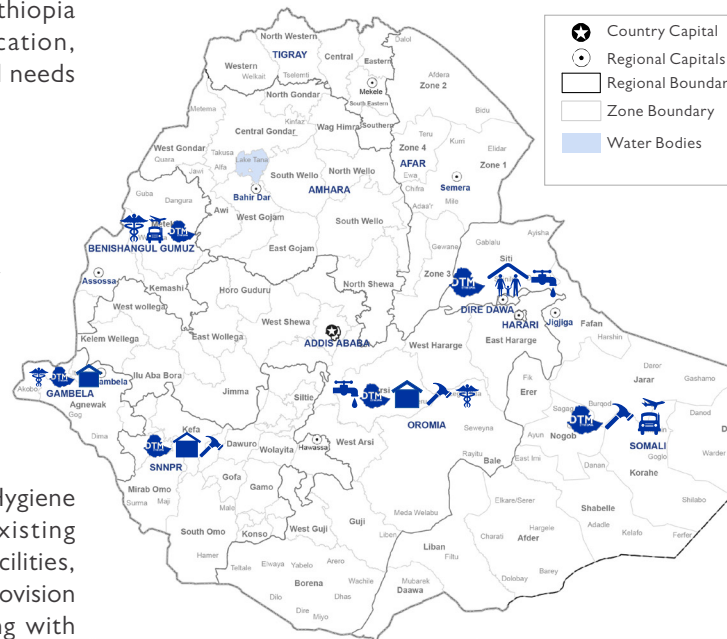
Providing life-saving Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) assistance by rehabilitating existing latrine, constructing additional sanitation facilities, rehabilitating water distribution points, and provision of key hygiene promotional messages along with hygiene kits.

REFUGEE TRANSPORTATION



Providing relocation assistance and protection in a timely, safe and dignified way for emergency road and air transportation from entry points to designated camps in Ethiopia.

TRANSITION AND RECOVERY



Addressing root causes of displacement to foster ownership, to provide transitional solutions to reduce longer-term socio-economic, political, and environmental impact that contributes to forced and irregular migration.

SITE MANAGEMENT SUPPORT



Ensuring equitable access to assistance and protection for IDPs living in collective sites, carry out site improvement activities to increase safety and dignity.

RAPID RESPONSE FUND



Meeting acute, emergency humanitarian needs of the most vulnerable populations, namely those affected by natural and/or man-made disasters.

MENTAL HEALTH AND PSYCHO SOCIAL SUPPORT



Strengthening community and family support, through IOM counsellors who facilitate individual psychosocial support, psychological first aid (PFA), and awareness sessions on the rights of people with mental health conditions.
