PROGRAMMATIC HIGHLIGHTS

SHELTER - NFIs - WASH

-  **101,749** Individuals benefitted from hygiene promotion activities.
-  **13,125** Individuals benefitted from cash-based assistance for shelter.
- NFI 10,962** Individuals benefitted from Emergency Shelter - Non Food Items (ES-NFIs) assistance.
-  **5,148** Individuals benefitted from rehabilitation of water infrastructure.
-  **5,148** Individuals benefitted from distribution of soaps and jerrycans.
-  **2,069** Individuals benefitted from rehabilitation of sanitation facilities.
-  **170** Individuals benefitted from transitional shelter support.
-  **440** individuals benefitted from agriculture tools, inputs, vegetable seeds, and poultry chicken.

HEALTH

-  **12,402** Medical consultations conducted.
-  **19,364** Individuals benefitted from health awareness sessions.
-  **3,229** Children less than five years old screened for malnutrition.
-  **1,892** Women of reproductive age benefitted from sexual and reproductive health services.
- H 512** Health assessments conducted.

DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX (DTM)

- **124,996** Internally Displaced People (IDPs) identified through Emergency Tracking Tool.
- **10,414** Migrants identified at flow monitoring points.
- **1.82 million** IDPs and **1.4 million** returning IDPs and their multisectoral needs were tracked.
- 1 National Displacement Report, 1 Site Assessment dataset, 1 Village Assessment Survey dataset, and 4 ETTs are produced.
- 7 information sharing workshops conducted.

## RETURNS & REINTEGRATION

- **1,337** Migrants (439F / 898M) benefitted from direct assistance and protection services i.e. food, water, accommodation, hygiene kits and onward transportation allowances. Among the 1,337 migrants, 192 were Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC).
- **706** returnee migrants from Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) were registered, profiled and screened for vulnerabilities upon arrival.
- **706** Vulnerable returnees from KSA assisted with onward transportation allowance (OTA) and NFIs.
- **41** Non-KSA returnees received AVR assistance
- **78** Returnees received economic and social support.
- **13** Returnees received one-on-one and group psychosocial counselling.

## MIGRATION GOVERNANCE

- Undertaken Capacity Development for Migration Management (CD4MM) validation exercise to pilot the approach. Two consultations were conducted involving IOM staff in Ethiopia, Department of Migration Management (DMM) team in Geneva, and CD4MM consultant.
- National Partnership Coalition (NPC) and Working Group's 2020/21 2-day Annual Planning workshop was conducted in Bishoftu from 29-30 September 2020. 24 representatives from different members of the NPC including the Working Group leads (Attorney General's Office, Civil Society Agencies, Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs (MoLSA), Ministry of Science and Higher Education (MoSHE), Federal Urban Job Creation and Food Security Agency (FUJCFSA), and Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) ). Two research findings on Missing Migrants and the interplay of social norm and stigma in relation to

- **78** Returnees received kaizen, Entrepreneurship and Psycho Social Support (PSS) training.
- **354** returnees received COVID-19 related cash support.

Trafficking in Persons were presented and discussed. Draft implementation plans are developed by all six working groups.

## OPERATIONS

- 25 Refugees departed Ethiopia for resettlement purposes.
- Documents of 53 refugees and migrants were verified on behalf of different Embassies.

## PROTECTION

- 30,548 individuals benefitted from Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS).
- 30,548 individuals participated in protection awareness sessions.
