 **1,531** (178F / 1,353M) Non-KSA returnees received health screening, accommodation and food, onward transport assistance, cash grants, psychosocial counselling, economic, and social support, as required.


 **436** Returnees received medical screening and referral.

 **44** Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC) assisted with Family Tracing and Reintegration (FTR) support.

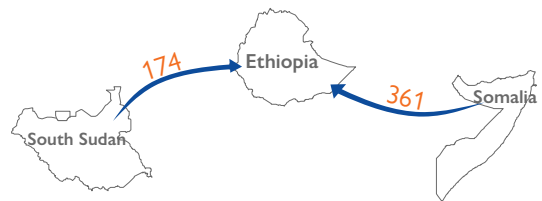

SPECIAL LIAISON UNIT

IOM was represented at the Sixth Africa Regional Forum on Sustainable Development (ARFSD-6) attended by over 3000 delegates in Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe, that ran from 24-28 February. The ARFSD, is an intergovernmental platform convened by the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA) in collaboration with the African Union Commission, the African Development Bank and the United Nations system to accelerate actions on the sustainable development goals (SDGs). This year's forum was held under the theme, "2020-2030: A Decade to Deliver a Transformed and Prosperous Africa through the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063" and looked at progress in the implementation of all the 17 SDGs, the challenges countries are facing, and how to bolster action.

Member States of IGAD assembled, both at experts and ministerial level, for final consultation to endorse draft protocols on Free Movement of Persons and on Transhumance in Khartoum, Republic of Sudan on 26 and 27 February 2020 respectively. Both Protocols will be presented later for consideration to the IGAD Council of Ministers. The Protocols were endorsed by seven of the eight IGAD Member States that were present: Djibouti, Sudan, Somalia, Ethiopia, Kenya, South Sudan and Uganda. IOM participated in the experts and High-Level Ministerial segments of the meetings, represented by the Chief of Mission and Representative to the AU, IGAD & UNECA who delivered keynote speeches during the opening sessions for the endorsement of the two Protocols.
