RETURNS & REINTEGRATION

Returnees received economic and social support.



LABOUR MIGRATION AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

OPERATIONS



Refugees departed Ethiopia for resettlement purposes. IOM facilitated the departure of 154 refugees by charter flight supported by the German Resettlement Programme.

MIGRATION GOVERNANCE

In coordination with other sub-units the Capacity Building team has participated on virtual meetings with Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs (MoLSA) on the establishment of a resource centre where migration will be integrated. Inputs were provided on the concept note developed by MoLSA.

A consultation workshop on IOM Capacity Development for Migration Management (CD4MM) package took place on 3-4 March 2020 in IOM Ethiopia conference room. IOM colleagues from Department of Migration Management, Africa Capacity Building Center (ACBC), Regional Office, IOM Somalia and IOM Ethiopia took part in the consultation.

SPECIAL LIAISON UNIT

The African Union and IOM, in close collaboration with partners commemorated the 2020 edition of the Africa Environment Day from 1- 4th March 2020 in Freetown, Sierra Leon, under the theme "Our Resources; Our Future". The theme underlines the central role of natural resources as foundation for sustainable development in Africa. One of the objectives was to raise awareness on sustainable environmental management among all stakeholders at national, regional and continental levels. The workshop also was a platform to highlight the plights of certain vulnerable people including women and minority groups with regard to access and ownership over natural resources in order to promote its sustainable management.
